### 6 Programme description (text for website), including information on employability

This PGDip *Creative Arts Education* consists of three modules that focus on teaching, artistic influence/practice and professional development within performing arts education. The modules aim to enhance your educational knowledge, develop your teaching skills, foster critical reflection, and support your growth as a teaching artist and professional in the field.

The MA **Creative Arts Education** consists of four modules; Students wishing to complete the MA Creative Arts Practice continue on to study Module 4 after completing the pathway though the PGDip to further pursue their professional development through an innovation project.

You can engage with this programme in a variety of contexts regarding your professional practice. This includes, but is not limited to, your work as: a teacher, lecturer, facilitator, educational manager or leader, course or curriculum leader, librarian, SEND tutor or educational administrator.

The programme emphasises the integration of academic research, practical experience, and personal insights to inform your teaching practice and career development in performing arts education.

**Module 1** encourages you to reflect on your own creative teaching practice and identify areas for development and improvement.

**Module 2** focuses on investigating a current industry topic in performing arts education, developing your educational skills, and considering your future growth and development.

**Module 3** centres around developing teaching practitioners in the performing arts, specifically as 'Teaching Artists', who integrate their artistic work with teaching expertise, exploring the interplay between skills and industry conversations.

**Module 4** provides students with the opportunity to create a comprehensive, professional strategy, tailored to individual career goals in performing arts education, emphasising proactive approaches, critical analysis and self-reflection for personal and professional growth.

The course is designed for professionals and academics working in performing arts educational settings, with an emphasis on critical reflection, facilitation of real-world

skills/development and analysis/evaluation of the sector, the relationship between artistic practice and teaching, with encouragement to build your sense of creative self.

We promote the combination of industry expertise, creative approaches, and academic rigour. For this programme, students will be required to develop a high level of independence, autonomy, self-motivation, drive, and determination to ensure completion of the course.

## 14 Overall student workload

Overall student workload consists of directed and independent learning, with each credit equating to a total study time of around 10 hours.

Whilst actual contact hours may depend upon the modules selected, the following information gives an indication of how much time students will need to allocate to different activities. Directed learning includes scheduled lectures, workshops, tutorials, and digital and online activity accessible through VLE (Moodle). This also includes placements, work-based learning, visits, and

peer learning. Independent learning includes private study and preparation for assessments and examinations.

This is an **independent**, **remote**, **distance-learning** course and students will be expected to demonstrate autonomy and self-motivation to complete the work.

The entire course is delivered online. Students are expected to engage in regular tutorials to progress through the levels of study and achieve the learning outcomes.

If students wish to accompany their work on the programme with work experience, placements, or internships, they are solely responsible for sourcing, organising, and undertaking that work.
